- To test whether there exists any significant difference in the opinion on sex education between
 - a) Rural and Urban school teachers
 - b) Private and Govt school teachers
 - c) Science and arts teachers

METHODOLOGY

Method used : Survey

Sample : 482 higher secondary school teachers in kerala

Tool : Opinionnaire on sex education

Statistical Techniques : Test of significance of difference between means for different categories, Analysis of variance (ANOVA)

RESULT

The study revealed that there is no significant difference in the mean scores of opinion of male and female teachers on sex education and there is no significant difference in the opinion of teachers of different categories on sex education.
