> To study the extent and nature of relationship between Job Satisfaction and Stress Coping Skills of primary school teachers.

To compare the level of Job Satisfaction and Stress Coping Skills between the relevant subsamples.

METHODOLOGY

Method used : Survey Method

Sample : 500 primary school teachers in Kerala.

Tool : Scale of Job Satisfaction, Stress Coping Inventory

Statistical Techniques : t-test, coefficient of correlation

RESULT

The results showed that negligible but positive relation exists between Job Satisfaction and Stress Coping skills. Mean scores of rural and urban school teachers are not differ significantly. Mean scores of Government and Private school teachers are not differ significantly.
