OBJECTIVES

To find out whether the main and interaction effect of Parental Stress, Teaching experience and Sex on Job Involvement are significant.

METHODOLOGY

Method Used : Survey Method
Sample : 400 Teacher Educators who are also parents
Tools : 1. General Data Sheet
2. Scale of parental Stress
3. Scale of Job Involvement

Statistical Techniques: Correlation, Three way Analysis of Variance with $3 \times 3 \times 2$ Factorial Design, Scheffe test for Multiple Comparison of Means

RESULT

- Among the two way interaction between parental stress, Teaching Experience and sex on job involvement only the interaction of Teaching Experience and sex is found to be different.
- There is no significant three way interaction effect of Parental Stress, Teaching Experience and Sex on the Job Involvement.
