### **OBJECTIVES**

To test whether the variables attitude towards teaching, Interest in Teaching and Teaching Experience have significant main effect on Job Commitment of Primary School Teachers.

### **METHODOLOGY**

**Method Used** : Survey Method  
**Sample** : 425 Primary School Teachers from Kerala  
**Tools** : 1. Teaching Interest Inventory?( Mumthas & Suja, 2006)  
2. Teacher Commitment Scale ( Mumthas, 2005)  
3. Scale of Attitude Towards Teaching (Mumthas & hafsath, 2003)  
**Statistical Techniques** : Three Way ANOVA with  $3 \times 3 \times 5$  factorial Design

### **RESULT**

- Attitude towards teaching and interest in teaching have significant main effect on job commitment of teachers.
- Teaching experience has no significant main effect on job commitment of teachers
