## **METHODOLOGY**

**Sample**: The study was conducted on a sample of 525 students of standard IX

**Tools used** : Parental Involvement Scale, Scale of Achievement Motivation

**Statistical Techniques Used:**T est of Significance of Mean Difference for Large Impendent Groups, Pearson's product Moment co efficient of correlation (r), Test of Significance of Difference between Correlation co-efficient

## **RESULT**

Parental Involvement and Achievement Motivation are significantly related and the relationship is positive and substantial. For the subgroups based on Sex of the student and Type of Management of the school the two variables are positively related and relationship is substantiated. Significant difference in the extent of relationship between Parental Involvement and Achievement Motivation was observed in the case of government and unaided school students
