Statistical techniques :Preliminary analysis, Test of significance of difference between means, Pearson's product moment co-efficient of correlation.

RESULT

There is no significant difference between the mean scores of goal orientation of high school and higher secondary school teachers. There is no significant difference between the Mean scores of quality of life of high school and higher secondary school teachers. There is significant relationship of goal orientation and quality of life of teachers in total sample and relevant subsamples
