

EGOISM AND PERCEIVED SOCIAL ALIENATION OF STUDENT TEACHERS IN  
COLLEGES OF EDUCATION

**OBJECTIVE**

To find out if there exists any significant relationship between Egoism and Perceived Social Alienation of student teachers for the total sample

**METHODOLOGY**

**Method** : Survey Method  
**Sample** : 465 student teachers selected from 14 College of Education in Kerala  
**Tools** : Egoism Assessment, Perceived Social Alienation Assessment Scale  
**Statistical techniques** : Preliminary analysis, Pearson's product moment co-efficient of correlation (r), t-test for large independent samples, Three way ANOVA (2×3×3 design).

**RESULT**

There is significant relationship between Egoism and Perceived Social Alienation of student teachers in the total sample and in the sub samples based on Gender, Faculty, and Level of graduation and SES.
